MINUTES OF THE

COMMISSIONERS' COURT

WORKSHOP MEETING - NOVEMBER 7, 2012

On the 7th day of November, 2012, there was a Workshop Meeting of the Commissioners' Court held in the Commissioners' Court, Rockport, Aransas County, Texas, with the following members present: C. H. "Burt" Mills, Jr., County Judge; Jack Chaney, Commissioner Precinct 1; Charles Smith, Commissioner Precinct 3; and Peggy L. Friebele, County Clerk and Christy Gibson, Deputy County Clerk.

Other County Official present was Lezlie Kirk, County Auditor; Richard Bianchi, County Attorney; Justin Cook, IT Director; Pam Heard, District Clerk; Bill Mills, Sheriff; and Diane Rinche-McGinnis, Justice of the Peace, Precinct 2.

The Meeting was convened at 10:00 a.m. at which time a quorum was declared by Judge Mills, WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had and done to wit:

Judge Mills stated the purpose of the workshop was to hold a general discussion with Tyler Technologies regarding their progress in implementing the Odyssey Program for Aransas County.

Erik Ernst, Project Manager for Tyler Technologies, presented a status report and project time line.

Judge Mills stated he heard there was a way to work with Hill Country on converting the Justice of the Peace data. Mr. Ernst replied there is at a cost of \$1,250.00 per extract that Hill Country stated they would honor. The cost would be \$2,500.00. Commissioner Chaney stated he was under the impression this cost would be borne by Tyler as part of the original contract. Mr. Ernst replied he would have to look at the contract before he could reply to this question. Commissioner Smith asked if Ernst wanted Hill Country to bill Tyler and then Tyler bill Aransas County and Ernst said that was his preference.

Tyler expects to go-live July of 2013 after several days of training with the departments.

Judge McGinnis asked the Court to allow her to keep Hill Country as well as Tyler until all her old cases could be closed. Commissioner Chaney suggested trying 25% of the case and if they convert correctly they should be able to convert all of them.

County Clerk Friebele asked that her office be the last to convert; however, was told all offices would go on at the same time. The County Attorney's Office is already on Odyssey.

No further business presenting, the Court adjourned was adjourned by Commissioner Smith duly seconded by Commissioner Chaney.
